The record of the Churt WI Monthly Meeting held on 12 October 2021

Welcome:

Marion welcomed 25 members, including Gill Rogan who joined today as a dual member, her main WI being Beacon Hill, and our guest speaker – Vivien Morgan. A COVID-19 risk assessment was carried out, and all measures taken to ensure a safe hygienic environment was offered to all members.

Finance: A big thank you for all the payments received so far for the Christmas Lunch. Just a reminder when making payment on-line to put in a reference, ie, Christmas Lunch or the name of the trip. No figures given as the books were being prepared for the annual audit.

Catering Officer: Di spoke about the difficulty getting enough volunteers to sign-up to provide the teas at the meetings. She pointed out that at the end of 2019 less than half the membership had signed up for 2020. Di was grateful to the ladies who stepped in this month when no-one was available.

Proposed 2022 'tea-rota' role: Di and Linda Lower, will cover the 'kitchen duties', whilst the volunteers provide the refreshments and serve. With full approval of the committee everyone will be given £5.00 towards the cost of the items provided.

Do we continue to provide sandwiches and cake? Di explained that if the volunteers were to continue to each make a cake and a loaf of sandwiches then this will mean that potentially we will need 27 volunteers prepared to provide them. To decide this Di asked the members present to vote with the raising of hands as to whether we continue to provide sandwiches in the future, and the consensus in the room was that sandwiches were not necessary. It was also agreed that a bought cake will suffice, if necessary.

Christmas Lunch reminder: Tuesday 14 December. List available to sign and 3 payment methods accepted.

Allergens: Following new legislation introduced on 1 October, Di highlighted the need to be aware of 14 serious allergens. Whilst this doesn't affect us directly at monthly meetings, she felt it good practice to make members aware of the ingredients. Details were placed on the notice board. Direct sales to the public are of greater concern and requirements for this are under discussion, in view of the Autumn Bazaar and 2022 fete.
