Coronation Tree Planting

The tree to mark the Coronation has now been planted on Redhearn Green close to the War Memorial. We chose a *Liquidambar styraciflua* 'Worplesdon', a winner of an RHS Award of Garden Merit and which is well known for its Autumn foliage colour in brilliant shades of gold through deep orange to red. This species is often mistaken for a maple as the foliage is similar in appearance, but it is in fact a Sweet Gum which has its origin in North America. Sweet Gum trees are traditionally important resources for medicinal and other beneficial compounds, derived from the resinous sap. Its botanical name was derived by Linneaus in 1753 from both Latin and Arabic words which can be loosely translated as 'flowing with fragrant sap'.

The 'Worplesdon' variety has its roots firmly in this country and was selected from seeds from the United States, by the Merrist Wood Agricultural College in Worplesdon. This variety is stronger and better withstands the wet, windy climates in north-western Europe, growing up to 15 metres high with a semi-open, pyramidal crown. Our tree was grown by the local *C G J Mathias & Son* nursery near Tilford.

Thank you to Cllr Johnson for sourcing the tree, and for those who helped her plant it.
